Obolition of road tax

The road tax disc has been around since 1921 with its introduction to prove the payment of taxes for vehicle use on public roads. Prior to 1921, tolls were a form of taxation and anyone who used the public highway would have to pay up.

The first road tax discs had no perforations around the edge. People either cut around the shape, or folded the edges to adhere to the law to make them round. These tax discs were the norm until 1938 when a circular perforation was then designed to make it simpler. Motorists were now able to cut around the perforation easier and slot the disc into a holder.

The introduction of the road tax disc reformation

After all these years of using the road tax disc, it's finally coming to an end thanks to our modern day technology. The abolishment of the disc is October 2014. For some people it will be a time for mourning and others will be a great time of joy.

You either love or hate the tax disc, however it does appear the majority of us won't be sad to see it go. After all, it has been a hassle for most, just the thought of having to find your insurance certificate and last MoT document can be quite a hassle. To top that, you then need to drive to your local post office and stand in a long queue, for some folks this hassle has to be done on a lunch break. Naturally, this does not sound too pretty so it stands to reason why many are glad to see the road tax disc go. However, the introduction of ordering your next tax disc online has helped in recent years.

There are a minority of drivers who are old-school and may find it quite sad to see it go. Then there are the scrap road tax disc collectors who believe the whole idea of the abolition is ludicrous. The latest story of a young man called Jude Currie aged 11 from Cobham in Surrey has been fascinated by these discs for many years. He has collected thousands, which are now valued at over £10,000. The older the road tax disc the more it is worth.

Sadly, the road tax bill itself will not be abolished, we will still have to pay, but not display. The new system will be introducing annual, biannual or monthly direct debit payment options. Payments that are made annually will not incur any surcharges.

In this era where money is quite tight, monthly direct debits are a welcome relief. However, paying




on a monthly basis may not always be the best option as surcharges will be added. These charges can certainly mount up if you have many monthly payments. Please note 'first registration' vehicles, HGV's and fleet contracts will not be able to pay monthly.

Another sad change is that the road tax disc will no longer be transferable on private sales. This is to ensure the seller can't make out there's more tax available on the vehicle than what there actually is. The previous owner will be responsible to reclaim the unused period and the new owner will have to start afresh once the vehicle has been purchased.

The Reliant Scimitar was made between 1964— 1986. During it's 22 year production it developed into a range of versions including a convertible in 1980 . In 1984 Reliant launched the smaller Scimitar SS!

MG used the Magnette name on the K-type and Ntype cars in the 1930's, but the magnette models of the 1950's and 60's are probably the best remembered. Although still loved today, the use of the magnettee name on an MG saloon car with a lowered Wolseley body and an Austin engine brought protest from motor magazine letter writers.





The 1200 was introduced in Turin Motor Show in November 1957. The 1220 Fiat or Granluce Fiat 1200 was intended to replace the Fiat 1100.

The Triumph Vitesse was a compact 6 cylinder car built by Standard-Triumph from May 1962 to July 1971. The car was styled by Giovanni Michelotti and was available in saloon and convertible models. The Vitesse name was first used by Austin on their 1914-16 Austin 20 (hp) and 30 (hp), this was followed in 1922 by Godfrey and Nash on their GN Vitesse Cyclecar and then by Triumph on a car made between 1936 and 1938. After the last Triumph Vitesse was made in July 1971, the name remained un-





used until October 1982 when Rover used it on their SD1 until 1986 and once more on their Rover 800, 820 and 827 models from October 1988 to 1991, at which the car was rebodied at the R17 version, which was produced until 1998 as the Rover Vitesse Sport.





Nash Metropolitan -As owned by Elvis and Paul Newman.... and the young lady neighbour I had a crush on as a boy! The Metropolitan was initially sold only in the US, but it was marketed in the UK between 1954-1962



Club Rules

As with all clubs and organisations, we have rules that MUST be abided by at all times. Serious breach of these rules may result in withdrawal of membership and any associated benefits.

1). To become a member you DO NOT need to own a vehicle.

2). In order for a vehicle to be registered with the club it must be at least 20 years old and will be at the discretion of the committee members.

3). Membership runs January to January, as such your membership will fall due on the 1st January irrespective of the date your membership commenced with the club.

4). Membership may be refused or terminated at the discretion of the committee without notice or reason.

5). Club stickers MUST be clearly displayed when attending shows. This is an insurance requirement!

6). Any conditions, including speed limits, time of entry/exit or any other rules imposed by show organisers must be strictly adhered to.

7). All vehicles attending a show must hold a valid insurance policy, a valid tax disc must be displayed and the vehicle must have a current MOT certificate. The only time a vehicle will not require an MOT and/or Tax disc is if the vehicle is tailored to the event. However the vehicle will still require a valid insurance policy if it will be driven under its own power on site.

8). Vehicles over 20 years of age will be eligible for judging at our own event at the discretion of the committee.

9). The Committee's decision is final.
